Updates for the Parent's/Carers of Christ's College Finchley **Headteacher's Word**

Dear Parents and Carers,

Please note that Mr Scott will take on the role as Head of Sixth Form following the installation of an interim leadership restructure at the school. This change has Mr Nielsen and Mr Hodges as Senior Assistant Headteachers for Curriculum/Staffing and Pastoral Leadership respectively. Mr Scott (Interim Head of Sixth Form) will lead on all matters relating to post-16 teaching, curriculum, welfare and behaviour for the time being. This will include induction into Year 12. I note that our Year 11 students have left their examinations feeling very confident and we are hopeful that this will translate into the excellent performance their efforts deserve.

Ms Scott is already acting Assistant Headteacher and is managing the transition programme for our wonderful new Year 7 pupils.

Kindly remind your children that no food is to be taken outside the canteen/Sarabi Hall. This includes consumption of packed lunches and food bought outside of school. The policy has led to a huge reduction in litter and thus the threat of vermin in our living areas. Kindly remind pupils why this is important and that we intend to use resources to further improve their environment eg the playgrounds and the Sports Hall. We are making arrangements to remove the table tennis tables (they are in a poor state of repair) and thus create a space where more group ball games can be played. To reduce the risk of serious injury, football will not be allowed on the rear playgrounds until the tables have been removed. This applies to the pupils in Years 7 and 9 who use this playground during breaks. All pupils will benefit from the extensive plans to continue to upgrade the facilities being led by the governors and my senior team. Over the next year this will include stunning transformations to the playgrounds and sports facilities and will all look forward to the vastly improved internal environment, that will result from our successful bid for the new heat pump to replace the fossil fuel burning boiler. As well as reducing our carbon footprint it will help create a far more comfortable environment for learning and teaching throughout the year.



Important information regarding – Routine Immunisations for young people

In line with the national immunisation programme all children in year 9 are offered immunisation boosters against Diphtheria, Tetanus and Polio (DTP) and Meningococcal ACWY (Men ACWY). This is 2 separate vaccinations one given in each arm.

Diphtheria, Tetanus and Polio booster

This booster dose is important to ensure a young person's continuing immunity and protection against these diseases.

Meningococcal ACWY

Meningococcal ACWY vaccination helps to protect your child against 4 types of meningococcal bacteria (groups A, C, W and Y) that can cause meningitis (inflammation of the lining of the brain) and septicaemia (blood poisoning). These diseases are very serious and can kill, especially if not diagnosed early.

We are due to immunise at your child's school Christ College on Monday 4th July Our consent process is electronic. In order to access the online consent form please click on the link below:

https://clchschoolimmunisations.co.uk/Forms/DTP

You will need to enter the unique code for your child's school. The code is CL137388.

Please ensure you submit your form well before our team are due to visit the school to ensure your child receives their vaccinations. The portal will be closed 24hrs before the date of the session.

We ask for your child's NHS number on all consent forms. This allows your child's GP record to be easily updated. If you are unsure of the NHS number it can be found in their red book, or you can search via https://www.nhs.uk/nhs-services/online-

We ask that the forms are returned, even if you do not wish for your child to be vaccinated to help us better understand your reason for declining the vaccination.

Meet the Governors – Sharmin Tarique

"I have been a parent governor at CCF since June 2021. I have a daughter in year 8 at CCF and a younger daughter who is currently in year 5 at Martin Primary School. I have lived in London for most of my life and we've lived in East Finchley for over 14 years.

A little bit of background about me – I have a law degree from Kings College, London and also a Master's degree in International Human Rights Law from London University. I have worked as a lawyer with the Government Legal Department for over 20 years. One of the advantages of working in the Civil Service is the opportunity to move around and work in different areas of government policy. I have been involved in a number of interesting projects over the years, and have advised on environmental law, human rights issues, constitutional law

and even provided advice on royal matters! I particularly enjoyed my three years working at the Department for Education advising on pupil behaviour, data, academies and 16-18 education. I also have a keen interest in diversity and inclusion and have advised on equality policies.

In my current role (at the Department for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy), I have worked on the net Zero strategy, and I am really excited to see the results of that policy from the ground: the recent government grant of £1.9 million to improve the energy efficiency of CCF will transform the school estate and reduce our carbon emissions considerably.

As a parent governor, I attend Full Governing Board meetings, and I am also a member of the Human Resources Sub-Committee where we discuss a wide range of matters including staffing and wellbeing. In addition, I am careers link governor and am particularly interested in developing links with CCF parents who might be able to give a talk on their career and career path or provide work experience opportunities for pupils. I feel really privileged to have joined the CCF Governing Body at such an exciting time for the school."

CCF Erasmus+ HILS team visit Pallas Athene College in Netherlands





Dear Parent/Carer

From the beginning of the Autumn term 2022, all students (KS3, KS4) will have the opportunity to receive one-to-one instrumental lessons from visiting peripatetic music teachers in the instrument/s of their choice.

Tuition in the following instruments is currently available: Acoustic Guitar, Electric Guitar, Bass Guitar, Drum-kit, Violin/Viola, Cello, Saxophone, Trumpet, Trombone, Flute, Clarinet, Vocals/Singing, and Piano/Keyboard.

Students who are interested in learning a new instrument or want to continue their instrumental lessons at CCF will have the opportunity to follow different examination boards such as: ABRSM, Trinity, and Rock School towards graded exams. Students can also take up instrumental lessons simply for their own benefit developing expert skills on a musical instrument without taking music examinations.

Individual lessons:

The rates for the Autumn Term 2022 are:

- Option 1 £210.00 for 10 lessons of 30 minutes duration.
- Option 2 £144.00 for 10 lessons of 20 minutes duration
- Option 3 £108.00 for 10 lessons of 15 minutes duration (may share 30 minutes with another student if appropriate)

Music tuition is provided to by **Barnet Education Arts Trust (BEAT)**, all music teachers are fully qualified and DBS-checked.

Terms of music tuition:

The terms of music tuition are as follows, please ensure you have read and understood these terms as refunds cannot be offered once the school has committed and paid for its tuition requirement for the term with BEAT:

- Music tuition will take place during school hours in the music department and will require your child to miss lesson time to attend. However, students are expected to catch up on any work missed.
- Time slots will be posted to the Music Department noticeboard outside room 281. It is a student's responsibility to attend each lesson at the time allocated to them.
- Music tuition must be paid for in advance to secure a music tutor for a 10 week block.
- The school is not able to refund lessons missed by your child.
- A refund or credit will be offered if the music teacher is not able to deliver a lesson.

 Wednesday 29th June so that I can make the appropriate arrangements for instrumental lessons.

Payment must be made via Parent Pay, unfortunately cash and cheques are not acceptable.
